## Transition from Early Years Speech and Language Therapy Service to Reception

On entry to Reception, children are discharged from the Early Years SALT service due to age. We will reach out to you and offer a visit or meeting to discuss pupils in your Reception year group who have accessed the EY SALT service and may continue to require support [and whom do not have an EHCP].

**Note:** we will not be aware of all children with SLCN, for example, if they have never accessed SALT before or have accessed services in a different borough, so if you have any concerns about pupils communication development and would like support, reach out to your JCT Specialist Teacher or complete an ASK SAL referral: [click here](#)

We offer resources and training to screen pupil's communication development using the **Speech and Language UK Progression Tools**.

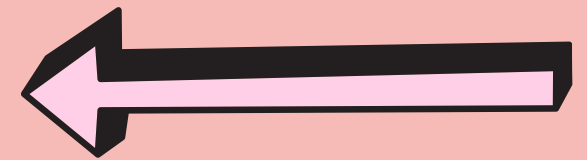
We recommend waiting until after October half term to screen pupils, so that children have an opportunity to settle in.

Communication development takes place when children feel safe and regulated, so join them as a co-player and focus on wellbeing first.
